t ^h	t'	Like t, but with a strong, short burst of air
t	th	Pronounced like a t but with the tip of one's tongue curled up and against the area just behind the alveolar ridge (the little bumb behind your upper teeth).
t ^h	th'	Like th , but with a strong, short burst of air
ts	ts	Like the ts in bits (note that this sound can come at the beginning of syllables in Hamāru)
$\widehat{ts}^{\mathrm{h}}$	ts'	Like ts , but with a strong, short burst of air
fs	tsh	Like the ch sound in English but a bit different. Place your mouth in the same position as for pronouncing \(\xi\), but abruptly stop and release air flow.

u	u	Like the o in do
